NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**TO CONFIRM LEVY OF ANNUAL ASSESSMENT FOR
PACIFICA HOTEL BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2014/2015**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to the requirements of California Streets and Highways Code section 36500 *et seq.*, the City Council will hold a Public Hearing on Monday, June 9, 2014, at 7:00 p.m. in the Pacifica Council Chambers (located at 2212 Beach Boulevard, Pacifica, CA, 94044) to take public testimony on the proposed annual levy of the assessment upon the business within the Pacifica Hotel Business Improvement District (BID) for the fiscal year 2014-2015.

On May 27, 2014, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 22-2014 affirming the Annual Report prepared by the district and declaring its intent to continue the BID program and levy the assessments for fiscal year 2014/2015 at the same \$1.00 per room per day of occupancy on the hotels in the City without change. The BID has been operating and levying an annual assessment of \$1.00 per room per day of occupancy on the hotels in the City continuously since 2004, including fiscal year 2013-2014. A complete copy of Resolution No. 22-2014 and the Annual Report are available for review in the City Clerk's Office located at Pacifica City Hall, 170 Santa Maria Avenue, Pacifica, CA 94044.

At the public hearing, the City Council shall hear and consider all protests against the proposed annual levy. A protest may be made orally or in writing by any interested person. All protests, written and oral, shall be made in accordance with the procedures prescribed by California to Streets and Highway Code sections 36524 and 36525. Any protest pertaining to the regularity or sufficiency of the proceedings shall be in writing and shall clearly set forth the irregularity or defect to which the objection is made. Every written protest shall be filed with the clerk at or before the time fixed for the public hearing. A written protest may be withdrawn in writing at any time before the conclusion of the public hearing. Each written protest shall contain a description of the business in which the person subscribing the protest is interested sufficient to identify the business and, if a person subscribing is not shown on the official records of the city as the owner of the business, the protest shall contain or be accompanied by written evidence that the protest which does not comply with this section shall not be counted in determining a majority protest.
