Action Minutes

February 17, 2021 6:00 – 7:30 P.M. via Zoom

In attendance was Chair Natesan, Vice Chair Arnos, Johnson, Kraus, and Patton. Sullivan, and Lancelle. Durkee was absent. Council Liaison Mayor Pro Tem Bier and Staff Liaison O'Connor were present.

CALL TO ORDER: Vice Chair Arnos called the meeting to order at 6:01pm

ADMINISTRATIVE BUSINESS:

Approval of Order of Agenda. Unanimously approved.

Approval of Minutes of January 20, 2021. Unanimously approved.

PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:

Paul Jones was providing comments on Cattle Hill and has concerns about the lack of maintenance on Cattle Hill, most notably on the waterbars. He is requesting some attention to be provided to the property before it gets too expensive to fix. Vice Chair Arnos requested this item to be agendaized next meeting.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

1. **Update by GGNRA/GGNPC:** None
2. **Update by City Council Liaison.** Mayor Pro Tem Bier provided update on available vaccine appointments and small business grants for restaurants and breweries. Provided update on Beach Blvd. Infrastructure Resiliency Project.

STAFF COMMUNICATIONS:

3. **Development project updates:** Staff provided update on the art structures for the Beach Blvd. Plaza, 4009 Palmetto Ave, 650 Cape Breton Dr. TUP.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

4. **Discuss update on addressing Mori Point trash and parking issues during Goal Setting.** Staff updated the Committee that Council decided to discuss this effort during Council goal setting. Staff reminded the committee that a subcommittee of Natesan, Johnson, and Arnos was formed to be a resource for Mayor Pro Tem Bier. Vice Chair Arnos recognized the various agencies that may be involved and Mayor Pro Tem Bier identified the level of effort that will be required to coordinate this effort. *Jeff Gulliet*, W. Fairway resident, discussed trash wasn't the primary issue, but bad acting visitors causing sanitation issues to the area, wanted increased signage, parking is an issue, would like to see a parking lot at HWY 1 location, and widen Mori Point Road. *Kelley*, W. Fairway resident, says garbage is everywhere and sees public works pick up the garbage, but doesn't want to see more trash cans, supported Jeff's comments on more parking. *Laurie Gaggero* echoed that visitors are bad actors, citing noise, vandalizing, thief, sanitation, and bonfire issues in the street. Chair Natesan summarized the issues as 1) trash, sanitations and restroom availability and 2) parking issues, and traffic safety issues.
5. **Consider trail naming survey materials for approval and deployment.** Subcommittee presented the survey, notice distribution efforts, on-site poster. The Committee unanimously approved the survey materials and deployment as detailed in the agenda. No public comments.
6. **Discuss messaging opportunities between wildfire prevention and open spaces.** Mayor Pro Tem Bier discussed that Emergency Preparedness & Safety Commission is talking about wildfire. The

committee suggested that a member of EPSC come to an OSPAC meeting. This item was continued. No public comments.

- 7. Discuss Preservation Award process and timing for 2021, review and approve notification language.** The request for nominations for the Preservation Award will be distributed. Nominations will be due by March 17th. No public comments.

COMMITTEE COMMUNICATIONS: Patton updated the committee on her hike with Kathy Kellerman, president of Pacifica Land Trust, Sue Gardner, GGNPC, on the 650 Cape Breton Dr. trail.
